Paying for College

In the school release section of your FAFSA, you must indicate federal school code 006228 for Methodist College. Once your FAFSA is processed you will find out which federal, state, and college programs such as loans, work study, and grants you may qualify for. Remember to file your FAFSA beginning Oct. 1 before the academic year you are applying for to be considered for all available funds. Other financial aid options to consider are Federal Direct Loan programs, grants and scholarships. Our Office of Financial Aid will be happy to navigate you through the process.
