- Submit a copy of your RN license

- Submit a writing sample (maximum 5 double-spaced pages) to admissions@methodistCOL.edu
- Submit OFFICIAL transcripts from all colleges attended

- **After submitting your application, you will be e-mailed a username and password for your CAMS student portal, where you can check the status of your transcripts and admissions decision, obtain a transfer credit report, and view financial aid information.**
- Once all official documents are received, an admissions decision will be made in 7-14 business days.
- If more information is needed, the Director of Admissions will contact you by phone and/or e-mail using the contact information specified on your application.

Minimum Admission Requirements

- ✓ Completion of a Baccalaureate Degree in Nursing from a regionally accredited institution with a nationally accredited program
- ✓ A cumulative GPA of at least 3.0 on a baccalaureate degree or cumulative GPA of at least 3.0 for the last 60 hours of baccalaureate studies**
- ✓ Valid RN license
