- Apply and submit application fee at www.MethodistCol.edu/apply
- Submit all official college transcripts High school transcript required for students with less than 30 college credits.
- Submit official SAT score (school code 1503) or ACT score (school code 1078) Not required for students who have earned 30 or more college credits.
 - Proof of graduation from stateapproved high school (diploma or GED certificate) Not required for students who have earned a college degree (associate or higher).

- The Bachelor of Science in Nursing (BSN) Prelicensure program is for students directly from high school or transfer students and includes all general education and nursing courses.
- The Bachelor of Science in Nursing (BSN) accelerated Prelicensure program is for high-achieving students who have completed all prerequisite general education courses (45 credits).

The undergraduate curriculum prepares graduates for entry-level professional practice in a broad range of healthcare settings.

ADMISSION REQUIREMENTS:

BSN - Prelicensure:

- High school GPA of 2.5/4.0
- Minimum ACT score of 19 or SAT score of 980
- Students who have earned college credit must have a cumulative GPA of 2.0/4.0 or greater

BSN - Accelerated Prelicensure:

- Minimum cumulative college GPA of 3.0/4.0
- Completion of all prerequisite general education courses

BACHELOR OF SCIENCE IN NURSING PRELICENSURE

Through classroom lectures, online learning, simulation experiences, and extensive clinical experiences in a variety of healthcare settings, graduates in the Methodist College Bachelor of Science in Nursing program are well-prepared for careers in nursing.

The Bachelor of Science in Nursing - Prelicensure program at Methodist College offers courses to fulfill the general education requirements of a bachelor's degree, but also works with students who bring in eligible credits from other accredited colleges and universities. Students in the program will be able to attend full time or part time, however, completion of the program is dependent on credit hours completed per semester and/or number of transfer credits applied and the sequencing of clinical courses.

The Bachelor of Science in Nursing - Accelerated Prelicensure is a rigorous program for transfer students who have completed all prerequisite general education courses (45 credits). Students enrolled in the Accelerated Prelicensure BSN will complete the program in five semesters, including summers, with full-time enrollment status (10-18 credits per semester).
