

Department of Human Services

Education: Master's degree required in a human services discipline or related social sciences field (e.g. social work, gerontology, clinical or counseling psychology, human development, family studies, lifespan studies, public health, or counseling). Earned doctorate (PhD or EdD) or planned completion within 18 months of hire in one of the previously identified areas or a closely related field is preferred.

Experience: Prior teaching in post-secondary education in classroom and/or practicum settings and paid work experience in a human services position in a direct practice or administrative role are required. Experience in case management, addiction, criminal justice, psychopathology, aging, family studies is preferred. The preferred candidate will have demonstrated experience in navigating human services networks within communities.

Qualifications: The candidate should have practical experience in a human service related area such as gerontology, wellness, community health education, health risks and promotion, and/or human development. The candidate should also have the demonstrated ability to collaborate effectively with internal and external stakeholders to the college, including the ability to develop professional relationships with local, state, and national agencies and organizations to promote practicum and service learning opportunities for students. Coursework in lifespan studies, wellness, community health education, health risks and promotion, gerontology, human development, or other closely related topics.

Licensure: Current, unencumbered licensure in appropriate field (e.g. social work, psychology, counseling) or relevant certification if it is a requirement of field of practice.


Reports to: Chair of Human Services Department

Responsibilities: Teach undergraduate coursework in the areas human services, including gerontology, case management, counseling, addictions, systems theory, and lifespan studies. Academically prepare students seeking an undergraduate degree in Health Sciences.

Salary and Rank: Faculty rank and salary are commensurate with qualifications and Adj for full time status.

Application Requirements: Current curriculum vitae, cover letter describing qualifications for the position, and transcripts (unofficial are acceptable for application, official transcripts required for hire).
