#### In Crisis: A Look at Opioid Addiction in **Central Illinois**

According to the U.S. Centers for Disease and



Control Prevention, opioid overdose deaths in the United States quadrupled between 1995 and 2015. reaching 64,000 in 2016. In Illinois, there were 1,946 opioid-related deaths in 2016, an increase of more than three-quarters since 2013. In this session you will

learn about trends and incidences of opioid abuse in Central Illinois. We will discuss opioids that are commonly abused by individuals and we will explore signs and symptoms of opioid misuse and treatment options. Finally, health professionals will learn about best practices in referring a patient or client displaying signs and/or symptoms of opioid misuse.
