Shannon Abernathie, Nurse Manager for the Senior Behavioral Health Inpatient Unit at UnityPoint Health Proctor Hospital, will explain different kinds of dementia, how it affects the brain and how health care workers can provide the best care to reach better outcomes for a patient's quality of life.

Attendees will be introduced to the Allen Cognitive Levels of Functioning and will learn to identify key care approaches for each dementia stage to promote the highest level of functioning in ADLs, mobility and leisure activity.
