

#### **Admission Process:**

- Apply and submit application fee at www.MethodistCol.edu/apply
- Submit all official transcripts
   High school transcript required for students
   with less than 30 college credits.
- Submit official SAT score (school code 1503) or ACT score (school code 1078).
   Not required for students who have earned 30 or more college credits
- Proof of graduation from stateapproved high school (diploma or GED certificate). Not required for students who have earned a college degree (associate or higher)

Students can start in the program directly from high school, or can be admitted with approved transfer credits from other accredited colleges and universities.

Graduates of the Medical and Life Sciences program are prepared for careers in clinical and hospital laboratories, environmental protection, public health, and a variety of nonprofit organizations. Successful graduates will be prepared to complete admission processes for advanced degrees in healthcare.

## MINIMUM ADMISSION REQUIREMENTS:

- Cumulative High School Grade Point (GPA) average minimum of 3.0 (on a 4.0 scale)
- Minimum ACT score of 22 or composite SAT score of 1100
- Students with college credit must have a transfer GPA of 3.0 or greater on a 4.0 scale.
- The high school schedule of courses taken is used to determine the adequacy of preparation for college study. It is recommended that at least 13 units of study be in college preparatory courses, including English (4 years), Social Sciences (2 years), Mathematics (3 years), Laboratory Sciences (2 years), and a Foreign Language or Fine Arts (2 years).
- If high school students meet only one academic requirement (GPA or ACT/SAT scores), students must complete 12 college credits following high school with a cumulative GPA of 3.0 or greater (on a 4.0 scale) for admission to the program.

## BACHELOR OF SCIENCE IN MEDICAL AND LIFE SCIENCES

The Bachelor of Science in Medical and Life Sciences degree can be completed in four years, or eight semesters. Classes are also offered in the summer session. Each student is paired with an academic advisor for career counseling and/or applying to advanced degree programs. Students benefit from career exploration, a capstone project, and an internship at a location selected in partnership with their faculty advisor. Completion time of the program may vary depending on the student's need for pre-requisites, or full-time or part-time status.
