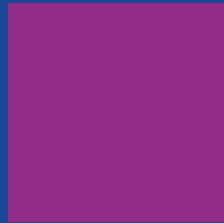
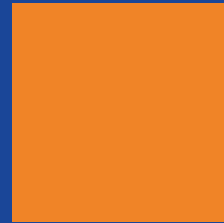

Methodist College is a college of choice for students wanting careers in healthcare and human services. What started as a nurse training program in 1900 has grown to become a four year institution offering bachelor's degree programs in Nursing, Healthcare Administration, and Social Work, and master's programs in Nursing. Certificate programs in Nursing Assistant and Medical Assistant offer career pathways for students wanting to enter the healthcare field.

With a strong arts and sciences curriculum, the general education faculty at Methodist College fine-tune their disciplinary content to professions in healthcare and human services, helping students to see how general studies provide a solid foundation for professional success.

OUR TEACHING

Methodist College's academic programs combine classroom instruction, online learning tools, research, and real-world clinical, internship or practicum experience. Simulation learning supports a clinical focus for students in a variety of programs to learn in a controlled, safe environment imitating real-life situations in healthcare.

Methodist College strives to utilize the most current evidence-based research to create a dynamic learning environment. Students are challenged to assess the situation, gather all necessary information, prioritize interventions, and self-evaluate their performance.

PROGRAMS & DEGREES

Bachelor of Science in Nursing (BSN)

Prelicensure – a traditional bachelor’s degree program for students entering directly from high school or as transfer students. Prepares graduates to take the national nursing licensure exam.

NEW Accelerated Prelicensure – an accelerated program for transfer students who have completed all general education requirements. Prepares graduates to take the national nursing licensure exam.

Second Degree – for individuals who have an earned bachelor’s degree in another subject and would like to earn a BSN. Prepares graduates to take the national nursing licensure exam.

RN-BSN – for licensed (RN) professionals who are graduates of either an associate degree or diploma nursing program and would like to earn a BSN.

Bachelor of Social Work (BSW)

Prepares students to work as social work generalists and to take the required licensing exam to work as a licensed social worker.

Bachelor of Science in Health Science (BSHS)

Healthcare Administration – a bachelor’s degree program to prepare individuals to work as leaders or managers in a variety of healthcare organizations.

Health Science with an Emphasis in Leadership – a completion bachelor’s degree for individuals who have an earned associate degree in allied health or have 30 credit hours in healthcare courses (*subject to approval by the Methodist College Registrar*).

Methodist College is accredited by the Higher Learning Commission and the baccalaureate and master’s degree nursing programs are accredited by the Commission on Collegiate Nursing Education. The Bachelor of Social Work is approved as a candidate for accreditation through speciality accreditation offered through the Council on Social Work Education.

(Transfer credits for any certificate, undergraduate or graduate degree program must be from a regionally accredited college or university.)

Certificate Programs

Gerontology – a certificate program that prepares individuals to work with our aging population. The certificate can be completed as part of a student’s program of study in nursing, health science or social work.

Medical Assistant – prepares students to complete administrative and clinical tasks in a variety of healthcare settings. Successful graduates will be prepared to sit for a national certification examination.

Nursing Assistant – a 9-week course to prepare individuals to sit for the State of Illinois Nursing Assistant certification exam.

Master of Science in Nursing

Generalist – Students can select specific courses to meet their education and professional goals.

Nurse Educator – prepares students to be nurse educators in higher education institutions or healthcare organizations.

Nurse Leader Executive – prepares students to advance as leaders within healthcare organizations.

NEW Prelicensure – for individuals with a bachelor’s degree in another subject, who want to become registered nurses and earn a Master of Science in Nursing for career advancement or to pursue doctoral studies.

UNDERGRADUATE ADMISSION REQUIREMENTS

High school grade point average minimum of 2.5 (on 4.0 scale)*

Minimum ACT score of 19 or SAT score of 980

Students who have earned college credit must have a cumulative GPA of 2.0 or greater (on a 4.0 scale)*

Demonstrated readiness or ability to successfully complete college level coursework as demonstrated through high school GPA, college GPA, and SAT/ACT scores.

*Higher GPA may be required for some programs. Please refer to www.MethodistCol.edu/prospective-admission-requirements for a complete listing of admission requirements.



UNDERGRADUATE ADMISSION PROCESS

Submission of a complete application for admission and application fee at www.MethodistCol.edu/apply;

Submission of official transcripts;

Submission of official SAT score (school code 1503) or ACT scores (school code 1078) *not required for students who have earned 30 or more college-level credits;

Proof of graduation from a state-approved high school program (Diploma or GED Certificate) *not required for students who have earned a college degree (associate or higher);

Students who are home schooled or from a school that is not accredited by the Illinois Board of Higher Education will be required to submit transcripts from the organization/program through which they obtained their materials for home schooling.
